- 2. Napulo ka buok mangga = 10 mangoes**
- 3. Baynte ka buok projects = 20 projects**

Existential sentences: Have / don't have

'y = contracted ; attach to pronouns

- Attach to "naa or wala" if no pronoun

= Naa'y / Wala'y

Earlier = Ganina/ Ganiha

Almost = Hapit

Pa = Still

Na = Already

Una/ Usa or sa [OOH.sâh.] = before; firstly

At once = dayon; diha-diha

Wait a moment = Kadiyot sa / kadiyot lang

Answer: Karon dayon = Right now

Kadiyot lang, **ipacheck** sa nako ni ni Boss. [kini = ni=this]

Talon = Ambak

Nag ambak-ambak = Jumping

Nagkatawa-katawa = laughing continuously = tawa lang ng tawa

Iyak = cry = Hilak

Naghilak-hilak = iyak ng iyak; other contextual meaning =nagdadrama

Iyak agad = Hilak dayon

Agad = dayon / agad-agad = diha-diha dayon

Mahitabo ang project mga lima **ka** tuig **sugod** karong tuiga.

Mangyayari yung project mga limang taon **simula** ngayong taon.
